Learning to Die, Part 1

Get to Know You

1. What are you thankful for this week?
2. When you hear the phrase – Dying to the sinful nature – what do you think of?

Digging In

3. Read Colossians 3:1-10. Verse 5 and following says there are things to put to death, and things not to put to death.

- What are we to die to, and not die, to?
- What does “put to death” mean in this context? Use other words to describe what Paul is saying.

4. Read Genesis 11:1-9. What did these people do that God took offense to (verses 3-4)?

5. Larry Crabb says, “We draw from our own resources in a determined effort to secure the advantages of life that God refuses to provide.” Or to put it another way, You are masters over some of your destiny but not all of it. But many of us try to control God's portion of our destiny. What happens when we do that?

6. How does “walking by faith” enter into this process?

7. How do we know what we should try to control and what should we trust God for?

8. “City building” is a metaphor for trying to control what only God controls.

- What is the best way to put to death this urge?
- How can we live in a way that goes contrary to this urge?
