During last week's Sunday scripture readings, we got a God's-eye view of humans. Even the bigwigs are "like grasshoppers." (Isaiah 40:21-23) That's not a put down. It does not undermine human dignity; we were created in the image of God. It just right-sizes us. It's protective. It's damaging to treat another person as though they are bigger than they are; the word for this is "idolatry." It hurts the idolater, and it hurts the one being idolized.

There are some current examples of people who were put on pedestals by other people, and now they're falling hard. Sometimes it's because a secret life is uncovered, and other times it is because of simple incapacity to live up to others' expectations.

My question is: **Who are we following these days?** If and as you feel yourself disappointed by human leaders, take it a step further and recognize that Christians are the people who centre on Jesus Christ as Lord. Jesus Christ, crucified and risen one, humble God, is reliable and powerful to truly change things. May we be the Christ-followers we claim to be, and keep him as our main One, our only One. It will be good for us all.
